Curriculum

Our curriculum is designed to enable students to achieve academic excellence whilst also developing personal skills and strong core values for future happiness, success and learning. An education at SGS is both traditional and innovative where, for example, students in Year 8 all study Latin and participate in cross-curricular, project-based STEM learning.

We offer a full range of specialist departments, providing teaching in English, Maths, Science (Biology, Chemistry and Physics), MFL (French, German and Spanish), Art, Design Technology, Ethics and Philosophy, Geography, History, ICT, Latin, Music and PE.

Older students also have opportunities to study Business Studies, Economics,

Law, Sociology and Psychology.

Personal and Careers Education is structured throughout the school through curriculum learning, Flexydays, Assemblies and Form Period activities.









Vertical Form Tutoring

One of the distinguishing characteristics of our school is vertical forms. This means that each student is in a tutor group with twenty other students drawn from across every year in the school. Most arrive in Year 7, so are the youngest in the group, and benefit from the experience and support of older

students. Students stay with the same tutor for as long as they, or their tutor, remain at SGS; so ensuring tutors are "guides at the side" of each individual student.

Each vertical form is attached to one of our six Houses. This gives students

wonderful opportunities to engage in inter-House competitions in Form Periods, on the sports field and in wider school activities. Each House also raises money for a chosen charity, thereby raising students' awareness of other people who are less fortunate than themselves.

Sport plays a huge role in life at SGS. All students, including the Sixth Form, take part in core PE lessons and inter-House competitions. Students develop their sporting skills in our superb Sports Hall, on our extensive sports fields and in outstanding specialist facilities such as our new cricket nets.

In addition we offer a wide range of extra-curricular sport including school teams for all years in rugby, football, cricket and athletics, and many teams in sports such as tennis, basketball and swimming. We maintain a full programme of competitive fixtures against local community schools and leading independent schools and award colours at the annual Sports Presentation Evening - a highlight for many students and their parents. In 2015 we proudly achieved the status of "Best state school for sport in Lincolnshire" as deemed by School Sport Magazine.

Drama and music are also a prominent feature of extra-curricular opportunities at SGS. The School has achieved consistently high standards in dramatic and musical productions and gained an enviable reputation. Such productions have ranged from a musical version of Shakespeare's 'The Tempest' to the Broadway musical 'Honk!', not forgetting our most recent 'Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat.'

Every show offers a wealth of onstage and backstage opportunities, whether it be controlling the lighting or sound rigs, managing the props or taking centre stage in one of the leading roles!

There are also many events in the School calendar that enable students to perform in various groups, including Christmas concerts and many charity events. The groups include junior and senior choirs, a concert band, and junior brass ensemble and a jazz band.

Instrumental and vocal lessons are available to all students through the Lincolnshire Music Service and freelance visiting tutors.
