## Year Nine Reading Focus: Love and Relationships

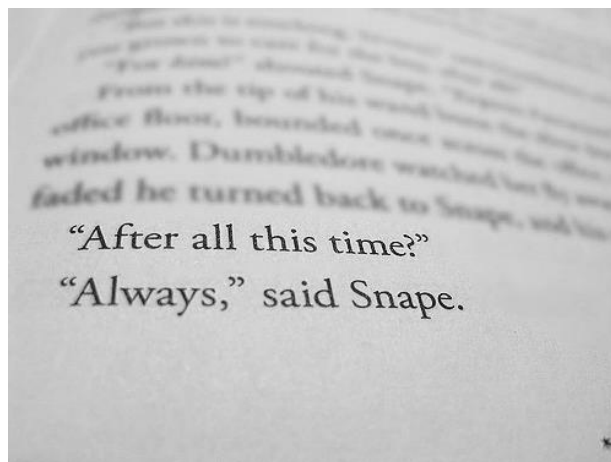
