

RELIGIOUS STUDIES, EPR AND CAREERS

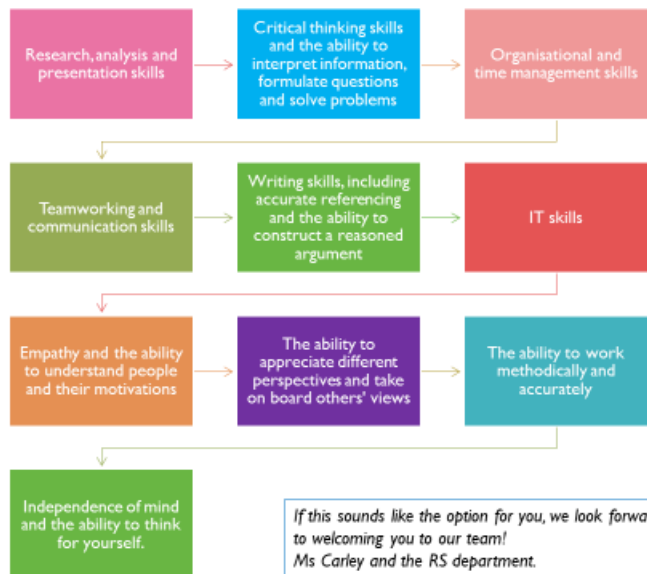
Religious Studies has been an optional GCSE for the last few years. However, the school has made the decision to include a compulsory aspect. The High school run a compulsory GCSE RS course which is examined for 'ALL' pupils. This is the message some of the boys are getting and it is not the case for our boys here. RS will still run as an optional GCSE alongside the other subjects. However, there will be the introduction of a non-examined course which will be called 'EPR', it will run alongside PACE and it will be part of their overall Personal Development program. All students will engage with a range of ethical, social, religious, spiritual and cultural issues within the context of discussions, debate and films.

There is NO assessment and it is NOT a GCSE.

Studying Religious Studies at GCSE or Religious Studies, Philosophy and Ethics at A-level can lead to a range of careers options such as Charity work, Social work, Humanitarian causes, the legal profession and Law, Journalism, youth worker, teacher, chaplain, mediator, community development work, Advisor, Equality and Diversity and Inclusion officer, HR, Archivist, Medical Ethics think tank, Lecturer.
